SAN MARIN HIGH SCHOOL is located 30 miles north of San Francisco in Novato, California, a community of nearly 55,000. San Marin is a public high school, which offers a comprehensive program of study to approximately 1150 students in grades nine through twelve. San Marin takes pride in its many award-winning programs in the areas of academics, athletics, and fine arts, including STEM Marin, a Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics program enrolling approximately 38% of students annually. Many of our students attend the most prestigious colleges and universities in the country. Because of our outstanding athletic and music programs, many San Marin students have been recruited by major colleges and universities and have been the recipients of numerous scholarships. Participants in our drama and music programs are among the finest in Northern California. San Marin music group have performed at music festivals throughout California as well as New York, New Orleans, Mexico, Canada and Australia. Our exceptionally talented drama students have been invited to represent the U.S. Team and perform at Edinburgh Fringe Festival in Scotland, the largest drama competition in the world. All of these exceptional programs are a result of strong support from the San Marin students, staff, administration, parents and the community.

SCHOOL DAY: Students typically enroll in six classes each semester with some students enrolling in seven or eight classes.

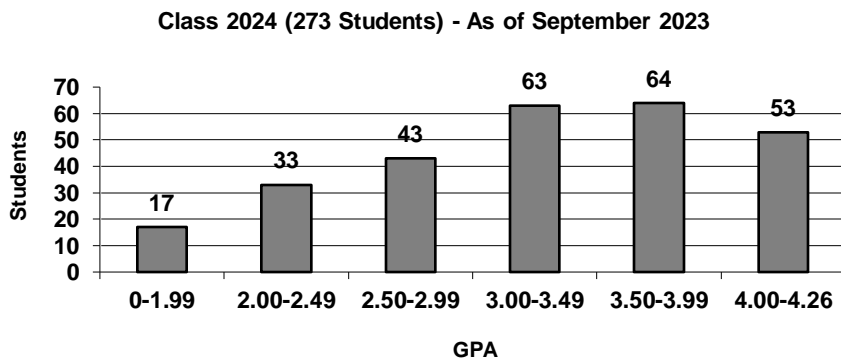
GRADES AND GRADE POINT AVERAGES: Grades A, B, C, D, F are used with the corresponding point values of 4, 3, 2, 1, 0, with the exception of honors and Advanced Placement classes in the 11th and 12th grades which are assigned an additional honor point for grades of A, B, and C. Beginning with Class of 2021, we do not rank students after the six and seventh semester.

NUSD REVISED GRADING POLICY FOR SECONDARY STUDENTS SPRING 2020

With equity and collaboration as our guiding principles, NUSD engaged in efforts to review the Spring 2020 Credit/No Credit grading policy for secondary students. On May 5, 2020 the Novato Unified School adopted a revised COVID-19 grading policy for secondary students (grades 6-12) for the 2019-2020 second semester. Students have two options to choose from - Option 1: Grades as of March 13, 2020 or Option 2: Credit/Incomplete.

ASSEMBLY BILL 104: New legislation provides options for students and parents/guardians to address learning recovery needs.

AB104 permits students to replace any grade earned for any course during the 2020-21 school year with a grade of Pass/No Pass, without negatively impacting their grade point average. There is no limit on the number of grades earned by a student during the 2020-21 school year that can be changed to a Pass/No Pass.
