# Senior “Preparing for College” Calendar

## August-December:

- Strengthen your college list and make sure it's a balanced mix of at least 6 academic safety, match, and reach schools.
  - **Safety** is a college that you likely have a very good chance of getting into and you can afford. Safeties should also be colleges you'd be happy to attend.
  - **Match** is a college you likely have a good chance of getting into that's also a good fit for you overall.
  - **Reach** is a college that may be more of a challenge for you to get into. Getting in isn't a sure thing, but it's realistic enough to be worth the effort of applying.
- Attend College Rep Visits! Refer to the Naviance page for more information.
- Stay organized and keep a master calendar or save application deadlines on your phone.
  - Write down all of your usernames and passwords
  - College application due dates.
  - Any forms and deadlines related to financial aid.
  - Any materials needed for your application, such as: letters of recommendation, transcripts, and a portfolio.
- Complete the FAFSA, **\*now a California State Law\*** the Free Application for Federal Student Aid. Remember to create your FSA ID and begin working on your application as soon as the FAFSA opens in December. The earlier you complete it, the better.
  - You can also complete the CSS Profile, an online application used by hundreds of colleges, universities, professional schools, and scholarship programs to award financial aid from sources outside the federal government.
  - School districts are required to confirm if a student has completed the FAFSA. If you have any questions or concerns about completing the FAFSA, please email your Counselor.

## STUDENTS APPLYING WITH COMMONAPP:

- Get ready for early decision, early action, or rolling admissions deadlines.
  - **Early Decision** You can apply to only one early decision college, and if the college accepts your application and offers you enough financial aid, you must attend that college.
  - **Early Action** You can apply to more than one early action college, and if they accept your application, you can accept right away or wait until spring to decide.
  - **Rolling Admissions** This means the college will consider each application as soon as all required information has been received and will usually notify you with their decision quickly.
- Ask a teacher and your Counselor for letters of recommendations if required for an application.
  - Click here for our Counseling Website and scroll down to “Senior Brag Sheet”
  - **\*\*\* CSU and UC do not accept Letters of Recommendation**

- Write first drafts of your [personal essays](#) and ask teachers, classmates, or family members to read them and give feedback. Make sure you proofread everything before sharing and submitting your essays.
- Finish the CSU application by Halloween and submit the UC application before Thanksgiving Break.
- Add your colleges on Naviance (see Naviance handout in this packet)

## January-May

When you start receiving acceptance letters and financial aid offers around mid-April, let your counselor know your decision and update your status in Naviance.

- If you have questions about housing options, talk to your counselor or call the college.
- Make sure you also [review your financial aid](#) awards and choose the aid package that's best for you and your family.
- After [reviewing your options](#), inform the colleges whether you accept or kindly reject their offer of admission and/or financial aid by May 1.
- Send your deposit to the college where you decide to enroll.
- [If you're waitlisted](#), stay active in school to show the college what you accomplished since you applied.
- Try to get a sense of your admission chances by contacting the admissions office about your ranking on the waitlist or asking if they have a priority list.
- If you intend to enroll if you're accepted, reach out to the admissions director and ask how you can strengthen your application.
- If you took AP courses, consider taking AP Exams to show what you've learned throughout the semester.
- Depending on the college, you may also [earn college credit](#) and placement.
- Ask your high school to send a final transcript to your college.

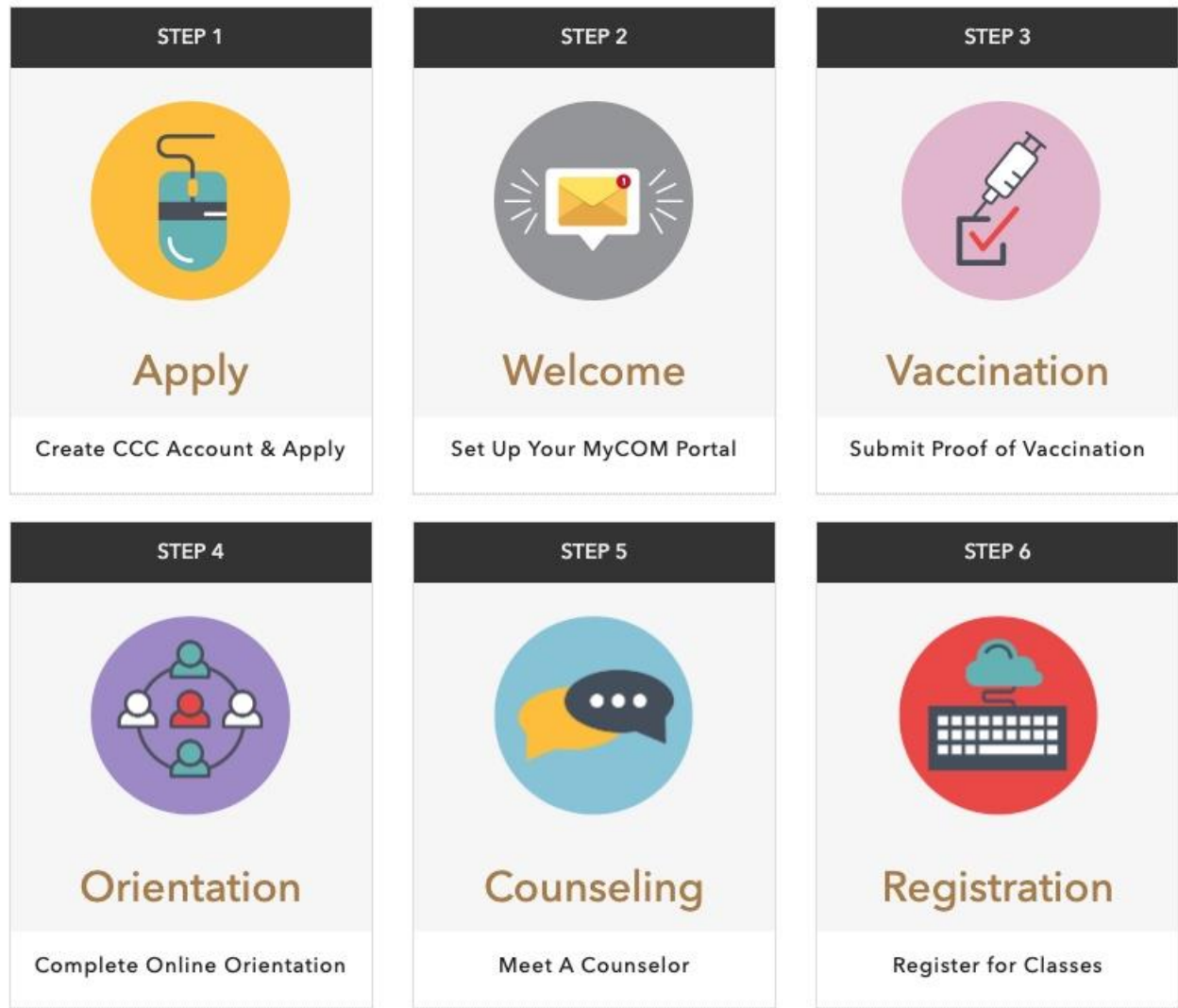

## UC Apply

### What you'll need

It's a good idea to have everything prepared before you start your application so you're not trying to track down information at the last minute.

Here's what you'll need:

1. **Transcripts.** Don't submit your transcripts to UC at this point, but refer to them as you fill out the application to ensure the information you enter is accurate.\*
2. **Annual income** for last year and the current year (your parents' if you're a dependent; your income if you're independent). This is optional unless you're applying for an application fee waiver or for the Educational Opportunity Program.
3. **Social Security number**, if you have one. We use this to match your application to things like your test score report, final transcript(s) and, if you're applying for financial aid, your Free Application for Federal Student Aid.
4. **Citizenship status.** You must enter your country of citizenship (or "No Selection"). If your country of citizenship is outside the United States, you'll need to provide your immigration status and your visa type.
5. **California Statewide Student ID** (optional). Each K-12 student in California public schools is assigned an ID number. If it's not printed on your transcript, ask your counselor or registrar.
6. **Credit card.** If you prefer to pay by check, you can mail your payment.

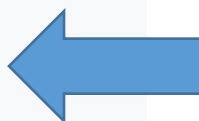

### What is this school's grading system? \*

When selecting your high school's grading system, please choose the system used by your school prior to COVID-19 disruptions. Even if you received Pass/No Pass or Credit/No Credit grades during the 2019-2020 or 2020-2021 academic years, you should still select your high school's pre-pandemic grading system such as ABCDF, 0-100 (U.S.) or 1-7 Int'l Bacc.

- 0-100 (U.S.)
- 1-7 Int'l Bacc
- Other

**A B C D F** grading is the answer to this question. You will still have the option to include a Pass (P) or Credit (CR) when entering courses for the 2020-2021 school year.



### What is this school's term system? \*

- Full year (1 final grade per year)
- Semester (2 final grades per year)
- Trimester (3 final grades per year)
- Quarter (4 final grades per year)

It is important to select both **Full Year** and **Semester** for term system. Students received **Full Year** grades for the 2020-2021 school year, as indicated on your transcript. You will select **Full Year** term system when inputting your classes and grades for 9<sup>th</sup> grade.

**Please be cautious in drawing conclusions from this information.** The numbers are useful only as a general guide to selectivity and not as a predictor of your chances for admission to a particular campus.

## Frequently Asked Questions

**Will not submitting an SAT/ACT test score hurt my chances of being admitted?**

**No. UC will not consider ACT or SAT test scores for admissions decisions.**

UC will not consider SAT or ACT test scores when making admissions decisions or awarding scholarships. If you choose to submit test scores as part of your application, they may be used as an alternative method of fulfilling minimum requirements for eligibility or for course placement after you enroll.

## **Transcripts & Letters of Recommendation**

Don't send official transcripts when you apply. If you're admitted to UC, then you must submit final transcripts to your campus admissions office.

UC does not accept letters of recommendation at the time of application. A campus may ask for them later as part of a supplemental review, so be sure to check your email.

## **California students**

If you're a state resident graduating from a California high school who has met the minimum requirements and aren't admitted to any UC campus to which you apply, you'll be offered a spot at another campus if space is available, provided:

- You rank in the top 9 percent of California high school students, according to our updated Statewide Index, or
- You rank in the top 9 percent of your graduating class at a participating high school. We refer to this as "Eligible in the Local Context" (ELC).

## **High School Courses Not Taken at San Marin:**

If you took a high school course outside of school to fulfill a requirement, it is important to include that on your application. Add the name of the school under **High Schools** and put the corresponding dates of when you took the course(s).

## **Credit Recovery**

If you took an APEX credit recovery course through San Marin, list that course and grade as a San Marin course exactly as it appears on your transcript.

## Filing Period:

\*When entering **San Marin High School** under **High Schools Attended**, **it must be entered twice** to reflect our 4x4 schedule from the 2020-2021 school year (see image below):


- August 2020 - June 2021 (9<sup>th</sup> grade only)
  - Enter **Full Year System**
- August 2021 - June 2024 (9-12<sup>th</sup> grade)
  - Enter **Semester System**
  - When entering Senior year classes, list Fall grade as **“In Progress”** and Spring grade as **“Planned”**
  - If you are currently in Economics, list your Fall grade as “In Progress” and Spring grade as “No Grade”. For Government, list your Fall grade as “No Grade” and Spring grade as “Planned”

## What is an “impacted” program?

An impacted major or program is one where more applications are received from eligible applicants during the initial filing period than the campus can enroll. These high-demand majors or programs will have additional admission criteria above the minimum CSU admissions standards. A number of campuses across the CSU have impacted programs. If you're interested in applying to one of these impacted programs, be sure to file an admission application during the initial filing period. Use the [Impacted Majors and Campuses search](#) to see if a major you're considering is affected by impactation.

## High School Courses Not Taken at San Marin:

If you took a high school course outside of school to fulfill a requirement, it is important to include that on your application. Add the name of the school under **High Schools Attended** and put the corresponding dates of when you took the course(s).

## Credit Recovery

If you took an APEX credit recovery course through San Marin, list that course and grade as a San Marin course exactly as it appears on your transcript.

## Cheat Sheet

When self-reporting your classes, let the classes autofill and choose from the options that are populated. Do not manually enter in any classes. This can cause errors with your application.

- Do not enter Health or PE classes
- If you are taking ERWC, enter “Expository Reading and Writing Course”
- For US History, enter “U.S. History”
- If you took STEM Chemistry, enter “Chemistry”
- If you took Biology (STEM), enter “Biology (lab)”
- If you took Biology (BT), enter “Biology (lab)”
- If you took Conceptual Physics BT, enter “Conceptual Physics”

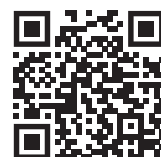
### How does WUE work?

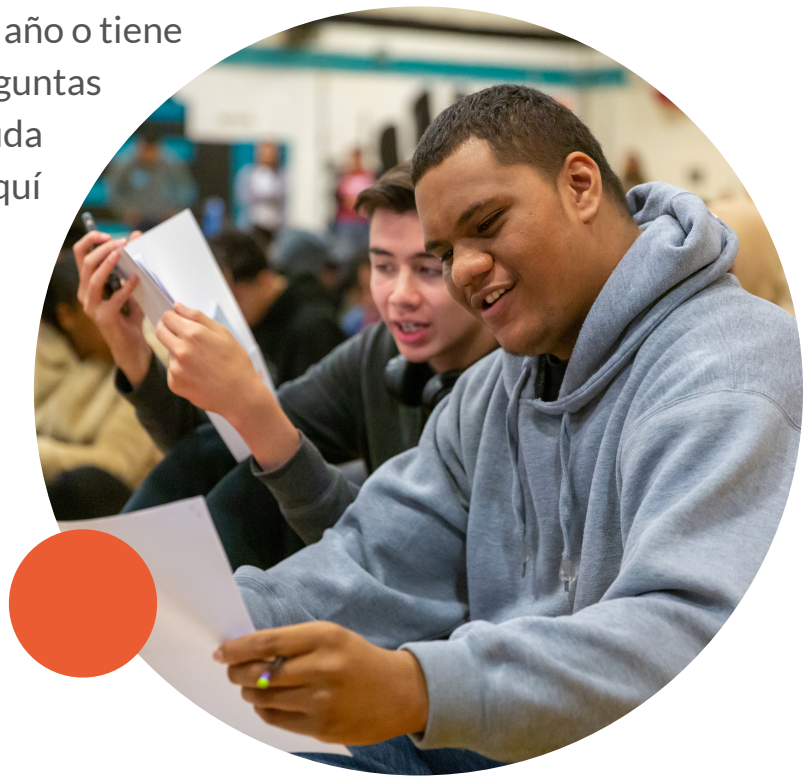

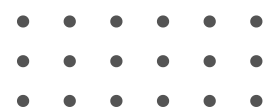

## FAFSA

- studentaid.gov
- For students who are U.S. citizens and legal permanent residents, and other eligible noncitizens

## CA DREAM ACT

- dream.csac.ca.gov
- For students who are AB540. Including undocumented students, or those who have a SSN because of DACA/TPS/U-Visa
- AB540 eligible: must attend 3 years of school in CA and receive High School diploma or GED

## TYPES OF AID

- **Gift Aid:**
  - Grants and Scholarships
  - Money that does not need to be paid back
- **Work Study:**
  - Money earned through on campus job
- **Loans:**
  - Borrowed money that needs to be paid back

This is a general list of the information you may need for financial aid applications. *If you believe you have a special circumstance that makes it difficult to obtain one of these documents, you can contact 10,000 Degrees for support or speak with your counselor/financial aid office representative.*

## FOR STUDENTS

If it applies to you, you will need:

- Social Security Number
- If student worked in 2022, **2022** W-2 form(s)
- If filed, Federal Income Tax Return for **2022**
- Legal Permanent Resident "Green Card"

## To add a college to your “Colleges I’m applying to” list:

- Click on **Colleges I’m applying to** link under **My Favorites** on the home page.
- Click on  icon on the right corner of the page.
- Type in college in the **Which college are you applying to?** box.
- Indicate **Application type**- ONLY private schools use Early Decision & Early Action. If you are applying to a CSU or UC, select Regular/Rolling.
- If you have not yet submitted the application, select how you will submit it under **I’ll submit my application Direct to the institution.**
  - If you have already submitted your application to the college, check the box next to **I’ve submitted my application.**
- Click the **Add Application** button- DO NOT click ADD and REQUEST TRANSCRIPTS. CSUs & UCs do NOT require a transcript at this point.
  - **If you are applying to a private school through CommonApp, you need to request transcripts through CommonApp directly.**
  - **If a CSU or UC emails you directly requesting a transcript at any point, email your Counselor *in addition* to requesting a transcript through Naviance.**
